



### BUILD TRUST

After a natural disaster, conflict, displacement or just over time there can be changes to a community, including in leadership, support systems and the people and organisations engaging with the community. There are also changes in risks and type of abuse and abusers. Building trust and working closely with communities is key to making programmes safe.

Communities can:

Identify what part of a programme makes them feel safe and less safe.

Explain what, how, when, where and to whom they would feel most comfortable reporting abuse by a CSO.
