
International Development

Discussion about people with disabilities and OPDs



We spoke to Diane Kingston, who works for Sightsavers.



Sightsavers is a charity that works on wellbeing for people with disabilities.

Sightsavers made a list of lots of OPDs across the world.

It is hard to make a list of OPDs because:



- There are lots of new OPDs.
- Sometimes OPDs have to close because they don't have enough money.
- Sometimes it is hard to find information on OPDs on the internet.



In some countries, not many people with disabilities are part of an OPD.

Some groups of people feel left out of larger OPDs.



Diane said organisations who want to work more with OPDs should:

- Work with different types of OPDs, including OPDs led by women.
- Invite OPDs to give advice on how to create new programmes.

Evidence and guidance on people with disabilities and OPDs




Research found that OPDs are being spoken to in government **decision-making processes** sometimes but not enough.

Organisations can work with OPDs in different ways, including:



- Helping organisations to make decisions




- Asking businesses and governments to include people with disabilities



- Helping organisations to work better.




Some organisations have made lists of OPDs to help people find them more easily.

What do these words mean?




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International Non-governmental Organisations (INGOs) are

have staff and members who are people with disabilities, who work on projects to help include everyone.




Research is about finding lots of information about a specific thing and bringing it all together.
